



REVEREND DR. IMELDA C. OKWUBUNNE

Is a dedicated servant of God, nurse, and community leader. Born in Nigeria in 1964, she became an American citizen in 2000 and has four children and three grandchildren. Called to ministry in 2002, she is passionate about sharing the love of Jesus, bringing hope to the hopeless, and providing comfort to the brokenhearted.

Through her outreach ministries, Widows Hope Outreach and Orphans Hope Outreach, she supports widows and orphans in Nigeria. In the Greater Houston Area, she provides extensive community service, including home visits, counseling, and providing meals to those in need. During the pandemic, she continued her tireless service, visiting the sick and bereaved, and volunteering with a ministry partnering with the Houston Food Bank.

From 2020 to 2024, she served as the Women's Director for the African Christian Fellowship Houston Chapter, where she united the women and demonstrated Christ-like love through compassionate actions. She is the founder of God's Abiding Love Ministries, a healing, deliverance, and outreach ministry, which she has led without a salary since 2005.

Reverend Imelda is an intercessor, mentor, counselor, encourager, and motivator who empowers women and serves people of all denominations through her "church without walls" and "church on wheels" ministry.



HOPE EBELE EGEMONYE ADODO

Has experienced God's supernatural blessings throughout her life, including being in need, having no one to depend on, and experiencing abandonment.

My first experience with missions began with the Ministry of Care to Haiti, inspired by Sister Joy's ministry. After undergoing hip surgery in 2007, I followed Sister Joy's path and became a partner in her ministry. Arriving in Haiti in 2009, I was overwhelmed by the need and heartache of the people we met. This led me to commit to missions, organizing African Christian Fellowship trips and participating in over 9 mission projects in Ghana, Nigeria, and Kenya etc. and I am always willing to support missions whenever opportunities arise. Phil 2:10-11.

Each experience of meeting people who have not heard about Christ really touches my heart in such a profound way. My prayer is that God continues to empower me and strengthen me so that I can continue to be a part of His grand design, and for the Ministry of Care to continue their endeavors.



MRS. CAROLINE CHINYERE NWACHUKWU OKEKE

Is a dedicated volunteer and servant of God. She began her volunteer service in 2003 at a Salvation Army store in Michigan, sorting donated clothes. After moving to Houston, Texas in 2007, she joined the African Christian Fellowship Houston branch, where she volunteered with the hospitality group to visit and assist the sick, needy, and bereaved. She also volunteered at Southwest Memorial Herman Hospital for two years before the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the pandemic, she volunteered at African Christian Fellowship, helping to distribute food to the community and deliver it to those who were sick and unable to leave their homes. She has volunteered with various other organizations, including Royal Ambassadors Ministries, Ministry of Care, Rescue Us Mission, and the Houston 5K Race. Currently, she volunteers every Sunday at her church, RCCG Shiloh Mega Parish in Sugarland, Texas, and at African Christian Fellowship Houston as an usher and hospitality team member, respectively.

Mrs. Okeke is deeply committed to volunteering as a way of taking care of people and giving back to her community. Her experiences on mission trips to Haiti, Ghana, Nigeria, and Kenya have deepened her commitment to serving others and sharing the love of Christ.

She is particularly inspired by the example of her father, who taught her the importance of giving to those in need, and by her sister Joy, who founded Ministry of Care. Mrs. Okeke's mission work has included providing medical care, visiting the sick and bereaved, and sharing the Gospel with those who have not yet heard about Jesus.

She is grateful for the opportunity to serve and prays that God will continue to empower and strengthen her for His service.



DR JANE AFIESIMAMA

Is a Board Member of Rescue Us Mission. She provides an excessive amount of time volunteering with widows, and young women that have been involved in sex and labor trafficking. She is a Pastor at her local church and is deeply involved with her church community. She currently an Educator in Sugar Land TX. She married to Dr. Boma Afiesimama and has 3 wonderful children and 1 granddaughter.

I derive joy and fulfilment in helping people, especially the desperately poor, or those in need and less fortunate than myself. By taking practical steps to uplift them, and recruiting other volunteers through advocacy and fundraising from the private and public sectors, I have generated resources and built capacity that has helped over 1.6 million people with their lives positively transformed in various communities in the USA and abroad, internationally.

DR. AMBROSE "SUNNY" O. OKORIE



Is a dedicated servant of God and champion of humanitarian efforts. As the founder of Relief Network Ministries, Inc. (RNM), he has spent over two decades addressing critical needs in impoverished communities across West Africa, South India, and the USA. Through RNM, Dr. Okorie has worked to provide safe drinking water, medical aid, and job skills training, empowering communities to achieve sustainable development.

His initiatives have included the development of water wells in rural areas, vocational training programs, and medical outreach services. In addition to his international work, Dr. Okorie has also made a significant impact in his local community of La Marque, Texas, where he established the Sunny & Saima Assisted Living Homes. This facility provides compassionate care for seniors with disabilities and has created job opportunities and training programs for caregivers.

Dr. Okorie holds bachelor's and graduate degrees in Electrical & Computer Engineering, as well as a Ph.D. in Artificial Intelligence. He spent 12 years as an academic and associate professor of Computer Engineering in Nigeria and the USA, and 10.5 years at Shell Oil Products, US as a senior analyst and IT project manager.

Dr. Okorie is married to Saima Okorie, and they have four grown children and three grandchildren. His unwavering commitment to service and ability to mobilize volunteers and resources have had a profound impact on countless lives, making him a true champion of humanitarian efforts.



JOY NKECHI CLEMENT

Is a devoted servant of God, founder of Faithfulness of God International Ministries (also known as The Blessed Woman), and passionate advocate for widows, women facing marital challenges, those with problematic children, and single women.

Born and raised in Lagos, Nigeria, Joy studied accounting and briefly worked with the Ministry of Defense before facing the heartbreaking loss of her husband while pregnant with her youngest daughter. After nearly nine challenging years of raising her children with limited resources, Joy and her family were blessed to migrate to the United States in 2002. In 2007, she founded her ministry, which provides prayer sessions, monthly prayer summits, annual women's conferences, mission trips, and outreach programs to support widows, elderly women, and children.

Joy graduated with honors in Biblical Guidance and Counseling in 2011, equipping her to mentor and disciple women of all ages.

She is the proud mother of six daughters and grandmother of five, and is passionate about sharing the Gospel, telling her story of God's faithfulness, and helping the less fortunate.

By God's grace, Joy hopes to continue this meaningful work as long as she is given the grace to do so.



APOSTLE BLESSING IGBOKWE

Blessing N. Igbokwe is a devoted servant of God, mother of five, author, apostle, and founder of Unveiled Women Ministries, a non-profit organization registered in Texas since 2011.

Through her ministry, Blessing provides for the needs of women and families through various outreaches and fellowships. Her initiatives include Operation Feed the Homeless, quarterly outreaches where she and her team provide warm meals, clothing, and prayers for those living on the streets; Back to School Events, which feature a Young Adult Conference, mental health resources, and back to school supply distributions; annual Thanksgiving turkey and food programs for up to 30 families in need; Women's Retreats, two-day gatherings where women can seek God, find peace, and build inner strength; City Revival Prayer Crusades, annual prayer calls for the nation and cities, featuring leaders from different churches praying over various areas of national need; bi-annual Women's

Conferences and Seminars aimed at empowering women for success in their homes, work, careers, and dreams; Service Awards, recognizing and honoring elderly individuals who have served their communities; and weekly activities such as evangelism, word and worship fellowships, visitations, and prayer chains.

Blessing is a graduate of the University of Lagos, Nigeria, where she studied Business Administration. She is a partner with Rescue Us, a mission against human/sex trafficking in Texas, and Project Dorcas Foundation in Nigeria.

Blessing is also a volunteer at Sugar Creek Baptist Church in Sugar Land, Texas, and a recipient of six service awards from her community.



DR. JULIANA KING

Is a dedicated servant of God, educator, and philanthropist who has made a significant impact in her community through her outreach initiatives. In 1991, she founded the International Image, Inc. scholarship foundation, which awarded college scholarships to first-generation African college-age females in America. She also founded the Miss African International and Miss Nigeria USA pageants, which awarded scholarships to African American college students in collaboration with the Pan African Organization and African embassies in the United States. These initiatives helped to build the self-esteem of young African American women and empower them to pursue their educational dreams without limitations.

Dr. King's community outreach has continued to the present day, despite the challenges she has faced as a widow raising four children. In collaboration with over 647 ministries in Nigeria, she has worked to feed, educate, and meet the needs of the less privileged in rural villages across the country.

Her initiatives have provided training for community leaders and empowered women to achieve economic sustainability for their families through market enterprises. Dr. King is also the founder of Juliana King University, a faith-based nonprofit private Christian institution that provides affordable Christian education to those who might not otherwise have the opportunity to attend university. Through her university, she aims to equip individuals and pastors with the spiritual and intellectual knowledge they need to become productive citizens of their communities and help to eradicate poverty. Dr. King believes that when communities are empowered with education and faith, they will excel, and most challenges will be lifted by families and others who are empowered to serve. She is a light that shines through the darkest of needs, and with God's guiding light, she continues to be led to meet the needs of her community.



DR. ADIELE NWANKWO

is a strategic visionary leader and Management Consultant in infrastructure development and services. He is the Managing Partner of Cincar Consulting Group, a consulting firm dedicated to helping clients deploy their resources strategically to create and manage infrastructure assets that transform communities. He works with senior executives individually and collectively to enhance their personal and organizational capacities to lead high performing organizations.

Brother Adiele is a committed member of the African Christian Fellowship and has served in various leadership positions with ACF. He is passionate about building and strengthening value-based entrepreneurship and economic empowerment skills to enable individuals and communities to reach their potential. He is particularly focused on equipping African youths with vocational skills to become productive economic members of the society that demonstrate the influence of Christ in the marketplace.

Dr. Nwankwo is Philanthropist and through his family foundation – Cincar Inyeaka Foundation (CIF) has provided bole hole to one of the villages in the most difficult terrain in Nigeria and donated a drilling machine to support water supply in Nigeria. He's an advocate of Skills Driven Entrepreneurship and was the Keynote speaker on this topic at Nigeria Institute of International Affairs (NIPA) in Lagos, Nigeria, in February 2024.

He and his wife, Robin, have sponsored over 40 young people focusing on the following skills: Solar panel and CCTV installations and repairs, Electrician, Auto Mechanic, Baking and Catering, Fashion and Design, Data Science Analysis, Cell phone and Laptop repairs.




